Log Cabin & Downtown Visitor Information Center: An authentic sod-roofed cabin.

Anchorage Museum of History and Art: Experience Native subsistence lifestyles, European exploration, Russian America and contemporary times.

Anchorage Memorial Park Cemetery: The city's original cemetery.

Anchorage Fire Department Museum: Fire Station No. 1 houses Anchorage's first fire engine – A historic 1921 pumper.

Alaska State Trooper Museum: Law and order in the "Last Frontier."

Wendler Building (Club 25): Featuring the only corner turret built in Anchorage and the Ceremonial Iditarod start.

Ship Creek: Fish for salmon downtown.

Alaska Railroad Depot: Built in 1942 featuring original woodwork.

Alaska Statehood Monument: Commemorates the Alaska Statehood Act, making Alaska the 49th state.

Historic Anchorage Home: Constructed in 1917, this home was referred to as "Cottage 22" during the development of the railroad.

Historic Anchorage Home: Built and designed by Leopold Davis, the first elected mayor of Anchorage.

Historic Anchorage Home: Originally owned by Andrew Christensen, Auctioneer for Anchorage's first land auction.

Historic Anchorage Home: Known as "Cottage 23," it was first occupied in 1917 by Walter DeLong, Alaska Engineering Commission general storekeeper.

Tony Knowles Coastal Trail: Spectacular views of mountains and the Cook Inlet on this paved trail to Kincaid Park.

4th Avenue Theatre: Art deco-style survived the 1964 earthquake.

Resolution Park & Captain Cook Memorial: Life-size statue of British Captain James Cook and view of Cook Inlet.

Oscar Anderson House: Built in 1915 by Swedish immigrant Oscar Anderson. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

Centennial Rose Garden: This park features 150 tea rose bushes.

Martin Luther King Memorial: Memorial honors Martin Luther King Jr.'s commitment to peace, unity and brotherhood.

Delaney Park: Originally a firebreak and the city's first airfield, today find ball fields and courts for basketball, volleyball and tennis.

Imaginarium: Award-winning children's science discovery center.

Alaska Public Lands Information Center: Discover Alaska's public lands through wildlife and cultural exhibits.

Historic Anchorage Hotel: Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, this hotel was constructed in 1916 with an addition in 1936.

Historic City Hall: Opened in 1936 to house the city's municipal services – now the headquarters for the ACVB.

Anchorage Market & Festivals (summer weekends): Great local products.

Planet Walk Exhibit: Begin here for an educational exhibit of planets throughout downtown to Kincaid Park.

Bear Totem, Ship Creek Center: Artist Lawrance Sheakley.

No. 556 Locomotive: Passenger and freight locomotive that traveled between Seward and Fairbanks between 1943 and 1959.

The Alaska Mint: Alaska themed coins and medallions.
